# A SURVEY OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES IN SELECTED NORTH CAROLINA PUBLIC SCHOOLS 

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## PREFACE

The Center for Urban Affairs and Community Services (CUACS) produced this report in association with the N.C. Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI), and in consultation with the Institute for Transportation Research and Education at North Carolina State University (NCSU). This report provides information derived from a Spring 2009 study of public school transportation in six school districts in North Carolina.

This report would not have been possible without those individuals who provided assistance and information for this study. 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## PROJECT OVERVIEW

The purpose of this research is to investigate the impact of changes in transportation services provided by public schools on decisions made by parents for transporting school-age children. A random survey of parents with children in six, selected school districts was conducted to gather information about the reasons for using and not using the school bus to transport children to and from school. The survey was conducted during the spring of 2009. Specifically, a survey of parents of school-age children was conducted to: ascertain parents' reasons for not using the school bus to transport their children to school; and identify what impact changes in transportation services are having on the choices that parents make regarding school transportation.

National studies show that children are at greater risk traveling to and from school by car, bike, carpool, and on foot than in school buses. Despite the apparent safety of the school bus, many parents continue to choose other means of transporting their children to school. In addition, public school systems in North Carolina and elsewhere are having to change or modify transportation services to deal with the significant increase in the cost of fuel for vehicles used to transport children. These changes are believed to be impacting decisions parents are making regarding choices for transporting their children to school. The survey information collected in this study will be used to provide accurate information to parents and students on safety issues associated with the school bus and other forms of transportation to and from school. Furthermore, the results of this study potentially could have national significance since this is an issue that affects transportation in school districts nationwide.

## SAMPLE INFORMATION AND SURVEY STATISTICS

- Surveys were sent to parents of 7,200 public school students.
- Surveys were sent to parents of children at 34 selected elementary, middle, and high schools in 6 selected public school districts.
- Parents were asked to complete the survey for up to 4 of their oldest children currently enrolled in public schools.
- 1,665 surveys were returned ( $23 \%$ ).

## General Transportation Mode Split Results

- Fewer students are driven by a parent in the afternoon than morning (30.4\% versus 42.2\%)
- More students ride the bus in the afternoon than morning (53.5\% versus $\mathbf{4 3 . 1} \%$ )
- More students ride in passenger cars in the morning than afternoon (54.6\% versus 43.6\%)

## MAJOR CONCLUSIONS

- Public school students in this survey mostly ride school buses (43.1\%) or are driven by parents ( $42.2 \%$ ) to school in the morning.
- Fewer students are driven by a parent in the afternoon than morning ( $30.4 \%$ versus 42.2\%).
- More students ride the bus in the afternoon than morning ( $53.5 \%$ versus $43.1 \%$ ).
- Most students don't ride school buses because of bus behavior concerns (22.7\%).
- Parents perceive bus arrival in the morning as mostly on time (80.9\%).
- Most students in this survey live 1.5 miles or more from school (73.5\%).
- Most students would walk to school (46.9\%) or ride with a parent (33.9\%) if they lived within 1.5 miles of school and no school bus transportation was provided.
- Most parents know their child's bus driver by name (57.3\%).
- Parents perceive riding the school bus as very safe (54.0\%) or fairly safe (38.5\%).
